

# Bloomberg U.S. Intermediate Corporate Baa Index

The rules of this Index are described in [Bloomberg US Corporate Index](#) ("Parent Index") with the exception of the "Features Specific to this Index" described below. These documents collectively constitute the index methodology for this Index.

The Bloomberg U.S. Intermediate Corporate Baa Index measures the Baa rated, fixed-rate, taxable corporate bond market. It includes USD denominated securities publicly issued by US and non-US industrial, utility, and financial issuers. The index is a component of the US Credit and US Aggregate Indices, and provided the necessary inclusion rules are met. The index includes securities with at least one year and up to, but not including, ten years until final maturity. The index was created in December 2004, with history backfilled to April 1, 2000.

<b>Credit Rating</b>	Securities must be rated between Baa1 and Baa3
<b>Maturity</b>	At least one year and up to, but not including, ten years until final maturity, regardless of optionality.
